A RESOLUTION ADOPTING FEES FOR RESTRICTED PARKING OPTIONS.

WHEREAS, Springville City employees work to provide neighborhood parking restrictions to citizens interested in obtaining them; and

WHEREAS, said proposed fees and charges have been prepared and presented to the City Council, and the City Council has determined that the said fees and charges are reasonable and necessary and directly related to the expenses associated handling the application, installing signs and with issuing permits authorized by the Restricted Parking Options policy;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of Springville City that the fees and charges for the issuance of Restricted Parking Options will be as follows:

An application fee of \$25.00 will be charged to consider the application for parking restrictions.

A sign installation fee of \$95.00 per necessary sign will be charged prior to ordering and installing signs.

A fee of \$10.00 shall be charged for each permit used under the policy, including replacement permits. Permits shall be valid for up to two years.

City employees and staff are directed to collect such fees and charges as are prescribed herein.

Passed by the City Council of Springville City this 17th day of June, 2008. This resolution becomes effective on the day following the date of adoption.
